Until the need is met, you are operating from a deficit. Theologian St. Augustine said, "Man's soul doesn't rest until he finds peace with God." God created us with the capacity to have a relationship with him. And until we do, our soul is at unrest. We seek to fill this gap with something other than God, but it doesn't work. It's like trying to put a square peg in a round hole. We try all kinds of things to fill the void; to satisfy the vacuum; yet without success. In John 10:10, Jesus said, ". . . I have come that they may have life, and have it in abundance." This refers to having a complete life; one that satisfies; one that is fulfilling. Jesus is the one that can fill the "God Spot." So in 2022, make sure you fill your God-Spot with Jesus! Let Him work through you to shine his light and spread His love.
