I wonder how many sermons spoke of 'Love' this past Sunday...? The late Queen Elizabeth II, when addressing family members of those who perished in the 9/11 terrorist attack, said: "Grief is the price we pay for love." Our Gospel reading on Sunday spoke of the foretelling of the grief that Mary would experience. CS Lewis also spoke of love: "To love at all is to be vulnerable. Love anything and your heart will be wrung and possibly broken. To love is to be vulnerable." We are called to be a people of love: "We love because Christ first loved us." [1 John 4:19] and 1 Corinthians 13 reminds us of how that love is demonstrated - not in the 'Hollywood Blockbuster' ways, nor in the value of a gift given, but in our everyday actions. Love demonstrated through patience, humility, truthfulness, forgiveness, bearing with one another and building one another up. In a few weeks time we will be reminded of the way in which God ultimately demonstrated the depth of love he has for all humanity - a demonstration of an unconditional and sacrificial love.

A SHORT REFLECTION ON SOMEONE ELSE'S REFLECTION!

I picked up an old favourite of mine today by Charles Spurgeon. I can really recommend it, 'Cheque Book of The Bank of Faith'. A wonderful title especially in today's financially focused volatile world! Today's reading was Proverbs 15:8. "The prayer of the upright is His delight." Spurgeon challenges us to "pray much and pray in faith. If our prayer is God's delight, let us not stint Him in that which gives Him pleasure. He does not consider the grammar of it, nor the metaphysics of it, nor the rhetoric of it; in all these, men might despise it. He, as a Father, takes pleasure in the lispings of His own babes, the stammerings of His newborn sons and daughters. Should we not delight in prayer since the Lord delights in it? Let us make errands to the throne. The Lord finds us enough reasons for prayer, and we ought to thank Him that it is so".

I loved this and two main things struck me. Am I "upright" in God's eyes today and should I be afraid to just pray for and with others? Firstly "upright"! Basically am I right with God? Have I listened for the Holy Spirit convicting my heart of any area where I am straying away and the confessed my sin? The practice of confession is possibly one area, outside church services, where I can be spiritually lazy! Possibly (almost certainly!) because I don't like to be told where I am going wrong! None of us do! Sigh! When I have confessed and repented (turned away from my sin) then, I am once more in a state of grace - "right" before God! Upright even! Of course some of us (sigh again!) may need to practice this discipline of confession and repentance more often! Please tell me I am not alone! God delights in my prayer? What mine?! Even when I am so often afraid/embarrassed to offer to pray with someone out loud? Afraid of the wrong words, of forgetting something, of sounding stupid, or of sounding fake, or just not even being able to utter the words! Yet, we are told He delights in our prayers. How many times have I so appreciated that someone has asked me, can I pray with you, can I pray for you? How can I then not do the same, to offer to pray, to bring my sister or brother before our God who delights in my prayers? I hear my girls saying "get over yourself Mum!" So I am challenged again, as I hope you will also be challenged to pray! Alone quietly or out aloud with or for others.

My words may stumble but God knows my heart and He is listening and delighting in my humble and often ineloquent efforts, as He will with yours! (Caroline Cliff)
