#### **WELCOME**

# **MOTHERING SUNDAY**

Mothering Sunday, is a day for special celebration of motherhood and honouring of mothers and mother figures. We celebrate the day every year on the fourth Sunday of Lent. The origin of Mothering Sunday could be traced to the pre-Reformation observation, in the Churches of England, of Laetare Sunday (a Sunday that derived its name from the first words in Latin, of the traditional introit for the service (mass) of the day: Laetare Jerusalem (Rejoice, O Jerusalem), taken from Isaiah 66:10, which speaks of the love for Jerusalem (the original 'mother church')). Laetare Sunday was a mid-lent special service/mass of rejoicing/celebration within the austere Lententide, when people were encouraged once a year, in the middle of Lent, to return to their 'mother' church, which could mean the church where they were baptised, or their local parish church, or the cathedral church (as the mother church of the diocese). In the post-Reformation times, it became customary for domestic servants to be given a day off at this time, so that they could visit their families, when they gave gifts to their mothers and families, including flowers they picked on their way and what they received from their masters. Eventually, this evolved in the Post Reformation Church of England (Anglican Church) into Mothering Sunday, traditionally marked by visiting and giving gifts to mothers on the fourth Sunday in Lent. It's a celebration of motherhood in all its forms.
