GOD SLOT

'In a little while you will no longer see me' Jesus told his disciples. This was before his death and subsequent resurrection. He was trying to prepare them for what was to come. In essence he was telling them that he was going to die and would be leaving them. They were going to feel dreadful but, he promised, there would be hope for the future. We recall that it was for just two days after his crucifixion that they did not see him. But, as he was dead and sealed in a tomb, they never expected to see him again. And they had been devastated - bereft, desolate, being orphaned would have been an apt description. But then they had seen him, unbelievably, alive; but they had come to believe. Jesus had overcome suffering and death with new life and from time to time from then on was physically present with them. Yes, his was a different sort of physicality. His body could get through closed doors and yet could still speak and eat and bear the scars of suffering. But that physical presence of the resurrected Jesus would come to an end. He tried to prepare them for the fact that he would leave this earth. We remember his return to heaven next Thursday when we celebrate Ascension Day, just 40 days after Easter Day. After Jesus' resurrection, those disciples must have spent many hours recalling what he had said to them, especially those words spoken just before his death. How were they to cope when he left them? What were they to do? He promised that the Holy Spirit would be with them. Those disciples would need all the help, strength and advice that the Holy Spirit could give them in order to be the physical body of Jesus when he left this earth. And you know what folks? We are Jesus' disciples today – Jesus' body on earth. And that same Holy Spirit is at work in us; to fill us more and more with the life and love of Jesus as we let him help us, to give us strength, to advise us and to draw us into even deeper relationship with God in prayer. As Teresa of Avila wrote in the 1500s, Christ has no body on earth now but ours! That's YOU and me. God Bless.
