Generosity

December is here again. It's a time for giving and receiving; a time to celebrate the generous gift of Christ coming into the world; an invitation to receive him again; an opportunity to be generous to others.

Many this year are feeling the spiraling cost of living and concerned about how this will impact their generosity in this season. Sadly generosity is often only judged by how much is given materially.

Mary, the mother of Jesus, in saying her quiet 'yes' to what God was asking of her, was whispering the giving of her whole self to God. Her "let it be to me as you have said" was the generosity we also see in Jesus during his 33 years of selfless service on earth. His ultimate "not my will but yours be done" was a massive act of generosity.

Jesus seemed to notice real generosity. He observed that some were more concerned about rules than meeting an immediate need. He watched what was going on in the Temple, some making a big show of their donations and others impressing him by giving the little which was all they had.

Generosity it seems has to cost something. May be it is in time being given to others which lessens time for ourselves? May be it is giving resources to others which are more than we can spare?
