Have you ever had one of those days when you needed to be in two places at one time? Let me rephrase that: Have you ever had one of those days when you didn't need to be in two places at one time? We've all been there, haven't we? More often than we care to admit. We're committed to a lot of different people and a lot of different entities – family, friends, work, community, clubs, the church; and not to mention taking care of ourselves. It's a juggling act. And when two or more demand our attention at one time, we're torn. That's the essence of stress: Being pulled in two or more directions at the same time.
