Gift Aid can boost Church finances:

If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the blue Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations.

If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration.

To make a Gift Aid declaration you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income.

Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

SYNOPSIS OF COUNCIL MEETING 8TH JUNE 2016

1. Minutes from the Finance Committee Meeting 30th May were received. It was unanimously agreed that Jacky Cotterill be asked to stay on the committee and Peter Latham was strongly recommended to replace Ray Elliott, who has stepped down, this was also unanimously agreed. Ray was thanked for all his hard work and Ray will continue to see the Chaplaincy House through to its Title Deeds.
2. The first draft budget will be brought to Council in September.
3. Graham Hare is meeting with Rupert Dodds (I.F.E.) next week.
4. Jacquie Hammond gave a report on the current position of the Interregnum and the Wardens' Conference.
5. A report was given by the 3 (G.P. / D.S. / S.S.) who attended the Church Secretaries and Communications Conference.

6. Canon Anthony reported on the first meeting of the Stewardship sub-committee.
7. Reports were received and questioned from the Churches, Wedding Ministry, Funeral Ministry, Fabric Committee, Personnel, Protection of Vulnerable Persons and Risk Assessment.
8. Archangel of Limassol have asked if St. Stephen's might be used as a "funeral parlour" for one hour before funerals take place. This was agreed and a charge will be made.
9. Additional information: 203 are now on the Electoral Roll. The ACP will celebrate Harvest on 9th October. Any funeral Orders of Service are now the responsibility of either the Undertaker or the family.
10. Next meeting 13th July.
