### **Overview from the Treasurer**

We are now three quarters of the way into the financial and calendar year. It's been a financially much stronger year than the worst-case scenario budget presented to the A.G.M.

There are still some major items of spending that will arise over the next three months including money being spent to get retrospective planning approvals for the Parish Vicarage and for recruitment plus end of contract costs relating to our Associate Priest.

At the end of September, we have a surplus of €6.5K which is well above forecast.

Principally this is because we have had 25 more wedding events than was thought to be likely when the budget was planned. Costs have remained firmly under control and are presently €6K less than they were at this time last year. We have spent €124K so far to run our Church.

After excluding large lump sum gifts received last year, congregational giving has increased by 10% to €66K and has covered 53% of our running costs. Thank you to everyone.

**Gift Aid can boost Church finances:** If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the blue Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations. If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration. **Please ask for a pen if you need one.**

**To make a Gift Aid declaration,** you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income. Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

#### **For our visitors and any residents eligible to Gift Aid:**

**PLEASE,** if you are putting your donation in a Gift Aid envelope, would you make sure that the details on the front of the envelope are completed; if this is not done we are unable to claim the tax refund.

### *GENERAL NOTICES*

#### **Pastoral Care: UK Expat Cypriot Residency – post-Brexit**

At a recent meeting of the Pastoral Care Team, questions were raised about the residency status that some of our older and long-serving parishioners currently have. The matter was raised with the British High

Commission and a summary of their answers follows:

The High Commission have been advising people since the referendum result (and prior) to ensure that they are correctly registered with immigration and that the old residency stamps in passports and old brown alien books are not sufficient. When Cyprus entered the EU in 2004 the procedures changed as per EU regulations so there is no 'digital record' of these people and they **must** legalise their status.

**Brown ARC book or stamps in passports**– this is what was issued prior to the new digital system.

**ID cards** – no longer being issued. Some people who have these may also have MEU1 or MEU3 papers so they are OK.

**MEU1** is a Certificate of Registration. It registers your presence in Cyprus, that is all. Also known as Yellow Slip. It should be done within 90 days of arrival. Current MEU1's do not have an expiry date. In the beginning they used to have. Anyone in possession of an MEU1 that has expired needs to renew it.

**MEU3** is a Certificate of Permanent Residence. It certifies your right of permanent residence and can be applied for after 5 years. Confusingly, it is also yellow!

**Citizenship** is becoming naturalised and a dual Cypriot/British citizen – totally a matter of choice.

For people with **ID cards**, it is advised that they should check with Immigration to see if they are 'in the system'. If they are, they should ask for a copy of their MEU1 or apply for one.

Anyone else with Brown ARC book or stamps in passports must go to immigration and at the very least apply for their MEU1.

Anyone not registered at all with anything must also at the very least apply for their MEU1.

The British High Commission's Vice Consul, Christina, had a meeting

earlier in the year with Elena Hadjigeorgiou who is the Head of Policy for Immigration in Nicosia. She confirmed that people who have lived here for more than 5 years and who have never had an MEU1 can go straight to MEU3 if they wish.
