WHAT'S GOING ON TODAY & THIS WEEK

Easter – a mystery?

A Seasonal Message from our Parish Priest, Rev. Andrew Burtt.

What do we do with Easter? Christmas is easy by comparison – needy parents expecting a first child who is born in difficult circumstances. Soon the family flee as refugees – escaping persecution. We see, sadly, all of this happening in today's world and we can readily identify with it and give to relieve the pain and hardship.

But Easter involves the child who is now a man. A man who could have been a hero, but no, a man accused of a crime. A man who seemingly will not help himself, who refuses to resist the clamour of the watching crowds and who dies painfully on a cross, to universal puzzlement. Then, three days later come credible, amazing, and shocking claims that he has risen from the dead!

Now Jesus' actions challenge. The resurrection brought puzzlement not empathy. And so it remains, on one level, today. Rationally, it is hard to accept and explain a risen Jesus. The challenge is to take the leap of faith, to suspend your legitimate doubts, and to take an experiment with the risen Jesus. Try putting your faith in this Easter Jesus. Allow him to reshape your life for the good. Test the claims that Christians make for this risen Jesus. Do this and surprises and a new way of life will result.

A happy experimental Easter.

Gift Aid can boost Church finances: If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the blue Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations.

If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration.

To make a Gift Aid declaration you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income. Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

For our visitors and any residents eligible to Gift Aid:

PLEASE, if you are putting your donation in a Gift Aid envelope, would you make sure that the details on the front of the envelope are completed; if this is not done we are unable to claim the tax refund.
