**Gift Aid can boost Church finances:** If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations. If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration. **Please ask for a pen if you need one.**

To make a Gift Aid declaration, you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income. Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

**PLEASE**, if you are putting your donation in a Gift Aid envelope, would you make sure that the details on the front of the envelope are completed; if this is not done, we are unable to claim the tax refund.

***GENERAL NOTICES***

**Change of Service time at St Luke's:** please note that in order to provide the best mix of services, while the parish has only one priest, it has been decided, in discussion with the St Luke's congregation, that from Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> March until Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> April, the service at St Luke's will start at 11.00am and NOT at 9.30am. I appreciate that this may not suit everyone, but this change will allow me to conduct the morning service at Ayia

Kyriaki and then drive to St Luke's for their 11.00am service. Without the change, this would not be possible. Reverend Andrew.

**Services of Communion by Extension:** please note that between now and the arrival of The Reverend Ken Waters, there will be a number of services, in the parish, of Communion by Extension. These will be conducted by either Ann Bailey or Ray Elliott, our two Readers. This situation occurs because there is only one Priest in the parish, at the moment, and your support and understanding are appreciated. Please continue to give to both of them, your support and prayers as they work hard over this period. Reverend Andrew.

**Ash Wednesday – This coming Wednesday (26/02/20)** marks the beginning of Lent. Communion services, with the imposition of ashes, will be held at Ayia Kyriaki at 9.00am, St Stephen's at 11.00am and St Luke's at 5.00pm. Please use these services to quietly signal your intention, to yourself, that you intend to keep a 'good' Lent of prayer and scripture reading and that your attendance is a sign that you intend to continue Lent, as you have begun. Reverend Andrew.

**Lent Course - Parish House:** This course (one of two in the parish) will run at the parish house beginning on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 10.00 for 10.30 for approximately an hour. The course dates are: Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> March, Session 2: Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> March, Session 3: Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> March, Session 4: Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> March and Session 5: Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> March Session 6: Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> April with Maqqie Le-Roy. This course will focus on answering the questions: 'What are the parts of the Bible that set your hearts on fire? What texts or passages or stories, in scripture, make your heart burn within you? The course will look at both Old and New Testament passages that relate to 'fundamental Biblical themes and motifs and which also find their echo in the Emmaus road story'. If you would like to join the group at the parish house, please make sure that you add your name to the sign-up sheet. Soup and rolls are served after both courses and a collection will be taken, in lieu of lunch, for the Ras Morbat Eye Clinic in the Yemen – our Lent appeal. Reverend Andrew.

**Lent Appeal:** as is customary, in the Parish, we will be holding a Lent Appeal for the Diocesan supported Ras Morbat Eye Clinic in the Yemen. A white envelope marked, Lent Appeal, will be available, from a sidesperson, for your donation. Please place it in the collection bags, as normal. At Synod, we received a very encouraging report on the work on this clinic which is staffed entirely by local Muslim doctors and nurses and supported by our Diocese along with some external donors. Despite the on-going conflict in this country, the clinic continues treat a large number of local people at very little cost to them and collaborates with other charities eg: Médecins Sans Frontières. We were informed that the work of this clinic is vital, and the acquisition of new equipment has greatly improved their ability to operate on cataracts. We have supported this clinic's work for several years, through our Lent appeal, and after hearing of their on-going work, I have no hesitation in commending our appeal to you. Reverend Andrew.

**The Reverend Ken and Wendy Waters:** we continue to wait for a date of their arrival in the parish but please hold them both in your prayers as they finish in the Wissey Valley Benefice, in the Ely Diocese, and prepare to move, live and minister in our parish. A photo and brief biography of the Reverend Ken are on our website. Reverend Andrew.

**The Reverend Navina Thompson:** The Reverend Navina is a non-stipendiary curate – the wife of The Reverend Canon Andy Thompson who is the vicar of St Andrew's Chaplaincy in Abu Dhabi. She was ordained to the priesthood in April 2019. Archdeacon John Holdsworth (Honorary Diocesan Directory of Ministry) asked during Synod whether the Anglican Church of Paphos would be able to accept Navina on a summer placement so that she could further her ministerial training and priestly formation in a different parish. I replied that we could and was assured that the Diocese would fund the bulk of the cost of Navina's

placement. HOWEVER, all rests on being able to find a suitable one-bedroom apartment for her.

Her time with us would begin in April and may extend into September. Do you know of a flat that we may be able to rent over this period? This is a very exciting development as Navina would be able to work, particularly with the St Luke's and St Stephen's congregations and have a brief to meet all in the parish. Please pray that all the arrangements will fall into place, especially the provision of accommodation and for Navina, herself as she prepares to join us on our Christian journey. Reverend Andrew.

**Baby Elliot Barnes:** In the intercessions, at our services, we have been praying for Baby Elliot (George Bates' great grandson) for a number of months. Thank you for your prayers. George has indicated that his condition has improved to the extent that he can now be taken off our list. George writes: *"Elliot's Cochlear implant has been activated with a positive result, and he will be having further therapy in the near future. I would like to thank you, on behalf of my family and myself, and to let you know that we can now look forward to his christening in five weeks' time at Pocklington Parish church"*. Thank you for your prayers and support and we wish George and his family well as he travels to Elliot's baptism. Reverend Andrew.

**Association of Friends of the Diocese:** our Diocese is supported by a very active Association of Friends of the Diocese, based in the UK. Their chairman is The Reverend Canon Ian Calder who has ministered on a locum basis, in previous years, in our parish and is now retired in the UK. **The Fortieth Anniversary of the Diocese:** This was marked in 2016 and a history of the Diocese was commissioned to mark this important event. The book entitled: *The Unfolding Story – A History of the Diocese*, written by Canon Angela Murray MBE, is a substantial work of some 450 pages and was published and launched at the recent Synod.
