Gift Aid can boost Church finances: If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the blue Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations. If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration. Please ask for a pen if you need one.

To make a Gift Aid declaration, you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income. Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

For our visitors and any residents eligible to Gift Aid:

PLEASE, if you are putting your donation in a Gift Aid envelope, would you make sure that the details on the front of the envelope are completed; if this is not done we are unable to claim the tax refund.

Dave and Fran Griffiths – Theological College Placement Students: We extend a warm welcome to Dave and Fran as they begin their two week placement with us today. Please introduce yourself to them and if you

want to offer them some evening hospitality, please let Reverend Andrew know. Their aim is to experience a parish that is significantly different from what they have previously known and to explore how the idea of Mission is worked out in our parish and 'What has been the impact of people's decision to relocate to Cyprus from a Pastoral point of view?' I will work up a series of visits for them both in and out of the parish but if you feel that you would like to meet them, please let me know. Below are pen-portraits for both Dave and Fran. Reverend Andrew

Dave was taken to church until the age of 11 but got out of going as soon as possible afterwards! He came to faith in Christ following a spiritual experience of God as a teenager. Dave joined the Anglican church following this. He met Fran whilst on Beach Mission in 1979, and they married in 1984. Dave had a number of administrative jobs, and then worked as an Education Welfare Officer in Liverpool. He trained as a Social Worker between 1993 and 1995. Whilst in Social Work training Dave developed an interest in working with older people. Following his training Dave worked with older people in both hospital and community settings.

Dave, Fran and the family moved to the Isle of Man in 1999 (Fran's home). Dave worked there as a social worker with older people, and then managed the Hospital and later the Community Social Work Team. He started training for ordained ministry in September 2017.

Dave considers himself to be both pastoral as well as interested in pioneering new initiatives

Fran was brought up in a large Roman Catholic family and came to faith in Christ at a mission as a teenager. Fran joined the Anglican church when she married Dave in 1984, they now have three grown up children. She originally trained and worked as a nurse in a variety of settings and studied Health Studies at university in Liverpool. In her forties Fran diverted into management within the voluntary sector developing and managing a befriending scheme for older people and subsequently started her own business in Domiciliary care. She managed this business until she was unexpectedly called to begin training for the ordained ministry in 2016 which she describes as a 'curved ball '!

Fran is particularly interested in pioneering new initiatives and especially in mission to those currently outside the Church. Whilst on placement she will be investigating how Mission in various forms is expressed in the diocese and how this relates to the Anglican Church's five marks of Mission.

This ministry has now developed into a wider context and issues of integration and multi-faith working are the new challenges being faced and addressed.

Come and hear how rewarding this ministry is and how you can make a difference to the lives of many people who live with us on this Island, far away from their homelands.

The meeting is normally for an hour with the ability to interact with the Speaker. After which there is light refreshments and time to socialize with other members.


