## **Church Finances in 2018**

At this month's Council meeting, the Church financial budget for 2018 was agreed.

Unfortunately the number of weddings being booked for next year seems to be about a third lower than this year. It means that the Wedding Ministry will not generate any money to subsidize the cost of running the Parish.

Overall, the Council voted to spend €21,500 of our remaining cash reserves to run the Church without further significant changes for a year. This is after fund raising from all sources of €11,000 have been planned.

Ideally, giving to the Church from all of us needs to increase from an average of roughly €7.50 per week each to €10 (€20 per couple). Everyone on the Council recognizes that some can afford more than this and others may not be able to stretch themselves to this amount. Please could you consider how much you can afford, so that the Church keeps going in its present structure, when you decide your planned giving (pledges) over the next few weeks.

If you do not yet take part in planned giving and are regular worshippers, please could you consider doing so? Sarah Sait has all the details.

The Council is considering a number of other measures, but we need to stabilize our finances so that raising money can recede in its importance for the Church's activities.

**Gift Aid can boost Church finances:** If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the blue Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations. If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration. **Please ask for a pen if you need one.**

To make a Gift Aid declaration, you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income. Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

**For our visitors and any residents eligible to Gift Aid:**

**PLEASE,** if you are putting your donation in a Gift Aid envelope, would you make sure that the details on the front of the envelope are completed; if this is not done we are unable to claim the tax refund.

**Kofinou Refugees:** Every Christmas our three worship centres support a separate project; St. Stephen's have 'The Giving Tree' in aid of the poor in the Tala area, St. Luke's support the Mission to Seafarers and Ayia Kyriaki support the children of the Kofinou Refugee Camp. Each year a Christmas party is put on for the children and Father Christmas will be giving out presents. We, and other parishes on the island are collecting money to be able to purchase gifts (up to €10) for the children; any donation towards this would be most welcome. Envelopes marked Kofinou Refugees are available from the sidemen today and next Sunday; your generosity will be most appreciated, and will gladden the hearts of the children.

**Wedding Coordinator's Role:** Trudie Murphy, our relatively new Wedding Coordinator, is nearing the end of what is almost her first full wedding season with us. At a recent interview, with her, it emerged that parishioners often expect her to be able to undertake wider parish inquiries and duties that go beyond the Wedding Ministry. Such inquiries and duties are not part of her brief and if you have these, they

should be directed to a member of the clergy or a Warden in the first instance.

I would like to introduce you to our Parish Pledge Giving Scheme. It is a way of maintaining personal stewardship of our regular financial giving to the church; it maybe in regular promised amounts, weekly, monthly, quarterly or annually in envelopes provided by myself for your use. It is

entirely confidential, and each person's envelopes are given a number, no names appear on them. The only person to know which number coincides with which name is myself; even the church treasurer when he calculates the total amount pledged each week in the WNS is unaware of the persons contributing unless the payment is by cheque. We are all aware of the financial situation in the world; this also affects the amount generated by our wedding ministry and no matter how much or how little is given, it gives our treasurer an idea of money to be pledged over the year. We are so fortunate here in Paphos to have three worship centres, but the upkeep/rent and other expenses of running them and also employing a Parish Priest have to be met. This is not the Church of England, we are and have to be a self-supporting church. Remember the prayer said at the offertory: Yours, Lord, is the greatness, the power, the glory, the splendour, and the majesty; **for everything in heaven and on earth is yours.
