**Gift Aid can boost Church finances:** If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the blue Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations. If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration. **Please ask for a pen if you need one.**

To make a Gift Aid declaration, you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income. Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

**For our visitors and any residents eligible to Gift Aid:**

**PLEASE,** if you are putting your donation in a Gift Aid envelope, would you

make sure that the details on the front of the envelope are completed; if this is not done, we are unable to claim the tax refund.

**Easter thanks:** Reverend Andrew and Canon Anthony wish to thank all who have offered greetings by way of cards (electronic or paper) or simply by word of mouth. All your greetings are much appreciated, looked forward to and enjoyed.

**Reverend Andrew - Days off:** Reverend Andrew will be taking Monday and Tuesday as days' off, next week and reverting, where possible, to Thursday as his day off from the week beginning Monday 13<sup>th</sup> May.

**Celebratory Moments:** I am well aware of how good we are at celebrating those big moments – especially significant birthdays - and rightly so! But have you ever thought of celebrating a significant anniversary – perhaps a wedding anniversary – with celebrations that have a distinctive Christian flavour. In the parish we often conduct up to twelve Services, a year, to renew and reaffirm wedding vows. These are very special services (see our wedding website for a sample copy) that can be tailored to the couple concerned and are often celebrated with family and friends, gathered. BUT, in over two and a half years we have not conducted such a service for any of our parishioners! You are good at coming to church, so why not come to church to celebrate a significant anniversary, a wedding anniversary, or perhaps another occasion. Your clergy are just waiting to be asked – make use of them! Reverend Andrew.

**The Archdeacon's Visitation Service:** once a year, Archdeacon John conducts his visitation service in St Paul's Cathedral in Nicosia. This is an important service that brings together parishioners from every Anglican parish on the island and is of a celebratory nature. The archdeacon preaches and his sermon can be loosely likened to a 'state of the nation' address in which he highlights significant progress (as well as challenges) that has been made in parochial and Diocesan matters that affect island parishes. Of course, with Archdeacon John; there is always a strong theological and biblical framework to all that he has to say. Celebrations continue after the service with tea and cake. This year's Archdeacon's visitation takes place on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> May at 2.30pm in the Cathedral. All are welcome to attend, and I am sure that you would find space in a car if you need a lift. Reverend Andrew.

**Attention all creative parishioners! The Anglican Church of Paphos needs you!**

Every year as many of you are already aware, the Anglican churches of Ayia Kyriaki, Paphos, St. Stephen's, Tala and St. Luke's, Prodromi sell quality printed Christmas cards. The money raised is donated to support the work of the church. Each year since 2015 card sales have raised more than €2000. Printing costs this year will kindly be paid for by the church as agreed by the Council.

I am happy to accept entries for a card design from anybody in the parish or linked to the parish be it home or abroad.

If you would like to submit a card design, please read the following information.

**Design a card in colour to be printed on white card in A6 10 × 15 cm size.** The illustration can be portrait or landscape photographic artwork in a variety of mediums or a graphic design, but they need to be *original* first hand pieces which must be A3 or A4 to permit scanning. A Christmas greeting can be included in the design. This can be added at the print shop stage if space is left for it. Metallic paints cannot be printed so use a shade

of yellow ochre, for example, instead of gold. Pastel colours tend to appear faded after printing. As the card will be quite compact it is advisable to use a design that is not too cluttered. A simple image can be very effective. After the designs are submitted a panel of people from the congregation including Reverend Andrew will choose the final four cards which are unnamed at this stage for a fair selection. The artists will then be asked to give their permission to print their designs exclusively for the church. Their name will be acknowledged on the back of each card and their work will be copyrighted.

I want to appeal to as wide an audience as possible who will enjoy seeing the cards in their homes this Christmastide both here and overseas.

Themes have been selected and these are: Nativity, A Paphos/Cyprus Christmas, A Christmas Carol, Christmas Tree, Christmas Gift.

Designs can be submitted to me via the Ayia Kyriaki office, any time up to Monday 3rd June as an original piece or submitted by email. Please use as high a resolution as you can if scanning and emailing.

**Thank you for your interest. I hope that you will feel inspired to get creative and share your time and talent to make card sales for 2019 a sell-out success. Please contact me if you need any more information.**
