### **Gift Aid can boost Church finances:**

If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the blue Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations. If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration.

To make a Gift Aid declaration you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income.

Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome

additional contribution to finances.

**Canon Anthony Stidolph:** Canon Anthony Stidolph joins us as Associate Priest in March. He has been ordained some 35 years, serving as a curate, a vicar, a rector and particularly as a school chaplain in the UK and Africa (Zimbabwe and Kenya). He is a trained musician and has continued to give recitals and to adjudicate music festivals and competitions throughout his priestly ministry. In 2008 he worked closely with the music and liturgy department at the Episcopal Cathedral of St. Mark in Salt Lake City, Utah, and has been a regular contributor on BBC radio since 1987. In recognition of his work and schools and education, he was made a canon of Christchurch Oxford in 2000, a title he still holds (though no duties involved!). He retired from teaching last year and so comes as "House for Duty" priest where he says he is looking forward to being part of a parish again, and getting to know the people in our congregations.

**St. George's Church, Baghdad:** During Synod the House of Clergy talked about its concern for the financial situation at St. George's Church in Baghdad. Since Canon Andrew White has had to be removed from Baghdad because of the constant dangers he faced, the parish no longer has access to the money given to FRRME, yet the number of refugees coming for help to the parish remains unabated. The parish faithfully continues to serve all who are in need and Synod was shown a video which was upbeat speaking of hope in the midst of trials. We saw the amazing work being done amongst vast numbers of children, both Christian and Muslim, in their kindergarten and the work of the clinic and bookshop. What was not shown in the video was the struggle the church has to pay its way. Currently, they have no electricity and are struggling financially.

Please pray about the situation facing St. George's church and pray for the Rev'd Faiz Jerjees and the hundreds of Christians who meet each week at its services and consider ways in which we might be able to help the parish in Baghdad. Rev'd Andrew

This money will really help to balance the ACP's books given that we have the one-off payments for the Parish Priest's House (title deeds, property tax, alterations, replacement furniture etc.). Thank you to all those who have agreed to continue contributing and to the new people who have joined. Although we do have the bare minimum of people required we really could do with some more people joining so if you have not done so already, please can you consider it and if you have any questions
