**Gift Aid can boost Church finances:** If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the blue Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your

donations. If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration. **Please ask for a pen if you need one.**

**To make a Gift Aid declaration**, you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income. Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

**PLEASE**, if you are putting your donation in a Gift Aid envelope, would you make sure that the details on the front of the envelope are completed; if this is not done we are unable to claim the tax refund.

A Reflection on the latter part of today's Gospel – John 6: 1-21

The Reverend Dr William H. Willimon (an American Methodist minister) reflects, in the final part of a sermon, on what should be the distinctive nature of the church ie what makes it distinct from other organisations that do good.

“Jesus is more than a prophet, more than a worker of wonders. Jesus is God with us, God present to us, God who comes out on the waves and in the midst of the wind to embrace and save us.

“Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and just then the boat reached the land where they had been heading” (6:21 CEB).

That may be about the best thing we can say of the disciples. They do not yet fully comprehend Jesus, yet they are growing step-by-step in their understanding of his true identity. They want “to take him into the boat.” They want to take him with them and thereby they reach the safety of land. And when they leave the boat, Jesus goes with them, and along with Jesus comes a new, expanded, deepened understanding of

Jesus.

This is the main purpose of the church. This is what we do that no other human institution does. This is the main thing, and woe unto us if we get distracted from the main thing. It's about being with, listening to, learning from, and worshipping Jesus as Lord, as God with us, the great I Am.

Today, gathered here in our congregation, you are much like the first disciples. You come here, thinking that Jesus is your good friend, or that Jesus is a wonderful teacher of spiritual wisdom, or perhaps Jesus is a worker of wonders who can help you miraculously escape the fix that you find yourself in.

Yes, but he is more. He is none other than as much of God as we ever hope to see in this world.

He is not just a spokesperson for God; he is God with us. He is more than a sign pointing us toward God; *he is God.*

Let's bring him in the boat with us. Let's sail with him wherever he takes us. Jesus, the great I Am who loves us enough to get in the boat with us and never leave us until he brings us home.”
