Gift Aid can boost Church finances: If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the blue Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations. If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration. **Please ask for a pen if you need one.**

To make a Gift Aid declaration, you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income. Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

For our visitors and any residents eligible to Gift Aid:

PLEASE, if you are putting your donation in a Gift Aid envelope, would you make sure that the details on the front of the envelope are completed; if this is not done, we are unable to claim the tax refund.

Personal Possessions: Please would you ensure that you have oversight, at all times, of your possessions during the service. Thank you.

Parish Appeal for the Sukhar family: (*REVISED NOTICE*) Over the past few months the Parish has given €3300 from its funds to help this desperately needy refugee family as part of its Christian Mission. This money was part of that budgeted for the rent of a home for a new Associate Priest, which we have not needed to spend this year. After a majority vote in Council, it was decided not to use further Parish funds to support such charitable action. This led to our appeal to the congregations and you responded magnificently by donating €1450.00. In addition a sizeable donation has been received from a family, in the parish, that will be dedicated to the family's rent over the next few months. Given the amount that has now been raised, we won't appeal further for the time being and will review what ongoing help is needed next year and we are hoping that the family circumstances will improve over that time. Thank you again for your generosity in helping a family that has faced being bombed out of their home, the deaths of two of their children, in that attack, and now the loss of benefits due to ill health. We are directed by our faith to help the poor and the needy, and this giving is truly part of our Christian duty. Reverend Andrew.

Harvest Sunday: Welcome to Harvest Festival Sunday. As we approach the beginning of the olive harvest, here in Cyprus; enjoy celebrating harvest festival and, if you are coming, enjoy your lunch at the Kamares Club! Our harvest collections are: at Ayia Kyriaki a collection of non-perishable food and toiletries to support the work of Caritas in Paphos; St Stephen's: a collection of produce to support local families in need; and St Luke's will collect non-perishable food and toiletries to support Solidarity, a local

organisation that helps needy people and families in and around Polis. There will be no white envelope collection, this year. Reverend Andrew.

Canon Anthony – Retirement: Canon Anthony has notified the Council that he wishes to step down from his Interim Associate Priest's position at the beginning of February 2020 and to finally retire. His last Sunday as Associate Priest will be Sunday 9th February 2020. At its September meeting, Council asked that the Diocese place an advertisement for a new House for Duty Priest, as soon as possible. Please pray for Canon Anthony as he prepares for his retirement and for the successful recruitment of a new House for Duty Priest. Reverend Andrew.

Diocesan Synod 2020: next year's Synod will be held in Abu Dhabi from Monday 3rd February to Thursday 6th February. Reverend Andrew will be attending along with two representatives from Council. Up to six observers from each parish are welcome to attend, at their own expense. If anyone wishes to take up this opportunity, please let Reverend Andrew know as soon as possible. Reverend Andrew.

Volunteers: volunteers are the backbone of our parish but do you know who the volunteers are who clean St Luke's church, each week or who compile the rosters of readers and intercessors or who work as wedding vergers? Thank you to all who volunteer their services to the parish. We are always in need of your help but we especially need to find two new wedding vergers (speak to Di Sylvester, Linda Turner or Carolyn Hart if you are interested) and new volunteers to assist the Pastoral Care Team (see Judith Perrett or the Directory in the WNS) and most particularly to lead intercessions in each of our churches. Anyone can volunteer to assist with the above be they permanent resident or swallow. Assistance will be given to help you 'find your feet' with each position. Parish Christmas Cards 2019: Update 3: Thank you to all who have already placed your order and to those of you who are still thinking about it. Our cards are now on sale. Buy your cards, now! Remember, proceeds

go towards our church funds and your support is vital. Do enthuse your friends to buy and let us know if there is an opportunity to place our cards for sale outside of our three churches. The British High Commission continues to alert us to actions that should be taken as Brexit deadlines loom. In a recent email they asked that we draw particular attention to the following:

1. Ensure that British Ex-pats in Cyprus are correctly registered with the immigration authorities with either MEU1 or MEU3. *Brown ARC books, stamps in passports & old Immigration Permits issued pre-Cyprus joining the EU are **obsolete**.*
2. Register for healthcare where applicable.
3. Ensure that their passport is valid for any future travel.
4. Exchange their UK driving license for a Cypriot one.

Recycled Cards: Sue and Lou won't be selling their recycled cards at either Ayia Kyriaki or St. Stephen's in the future; they will, however, be having a Grand Clearance Sale at the Autumn Bazaar at St. Stephen's on Saturday 26th October.

Sue and Lou wish to thank everybody who has supported them over the years. When they first started with Christmas and Easter Cards, 17 years ago, it was hard to buy greetings cards in Paphos but now they are readily available. Many thanks to all those who have passed over their used cards and those regular customers who have bought their cards every month. They have raised a lot of money for local charities but feel the time has come to move on to something else!
