**Collect:** Generous God, you give us gifts and make them grow: though our faith is small as a mustard seed, make it grow to your glory and the flourishing of your kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

**The World Council of Churches' Cycle Of Prayer:** We pray for the Republic of Cameroon; the Central African Republic and Equatorial Guinea and give thanks for the natural resources and diverse gifts that come from these countries; for Christians and people of other faiths who courageously have pursued reconciliation and peace among those in conflict; for those who minister to victims of sexual violence, trafficking and other human rights abuses; and for individuals and organizations who have provided for health clinics and schools in Cameroon and the Central African Republic.

We pray for just resolutions to the conflicts and violence among diverse groups and their leaders; refugees who flee to other countries, and for those who host them; economic developments that make it possible for all to rise out of poverty; and for stable democratic governments that effectively serve the common good.

**Our Province of Jerusalem and the Middle East:** We pray for peace throughout the Anglican Province of Jerusalem and the Middle East of which Cyprus and the Gulf forms one of the four dioceses, and for the compassionate efforts of indigenous Christians whose faith is rooted in the Anglican tradition, through Education, Health and Pastoral Care programmes.

**Our Diocese:** We pray for thoughtful, courteous, and stimulating communication across the Diocese. This week we pray for the Mission to Seafarers in Bahrain and for their ministry and pastoral care for all those who live and work at sea.

**In our own Parish of Paphos:** This week we ask all to hold in prayer the Parish of Paphos, the Parish Priest Andrew, our Interim Associate Priest Canon Anthony, and Readers Ann, Ray and Trevor. In particular we ask all to hold in your prayers our Reader Trevor and for bestowing of the merciful healing powers of Our Lord, and for strength and comfort for his wife, Sarah.

**Gift Aid can boost Church finances:** If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the blue Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations. If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration. **Please ask for a pen if you need one.**

To make a Gift Aid declaration, you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income. Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

**For our visitors and any residents eligible to Gift Aid:**

**PLEASE**, if you are putting your donation in a Gift Aid envelope, would you make sure that the details on the front of the envelope are completed; if this is not done, we are unable to claim the tax refund.
