**Gift Aid can boost Church finances:** If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the blue Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations. If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration. **Please ask for a pen if you need one.**

To make a Gift Aid declaration, you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income. Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

**For our visitors and any residents eligible to Gift Aid:**

**PLEASE**, if you are putting your donation in a Gift Aid envelope, would you make sure that the details on the front of the envelope are completed; if this is not done, we are unable to claim the tax refund.

**Plastic Bottle Tops:** Bryn and Christine Jones would like to thank everybody who over the last couple of years has been sending to St Stephens plastic bottle tops for charity purposes. Initially they contributed towards wheelchairs for the General hospital to assist patient movement, and latterly for medical equipment for Children with learning disabilities. Such was your generosity that we were dealing at times with near commercial quantities of plastic tops, which we consolidated into larger loads and then passed on to somebody else in the collection and consolidation chain. That collection network has started to break down as people have moved on, and for a couple of months we have been doing a lot of the "heavy lifting" ourselves. We have decided to call it a day as far as our involvement is concerned, however if you do wish to continue to 'recycle tops for charity' I notice that a number of the major supermarket chains now have collection bins in their lobbies, so you will be able to continue the good work.
