

Easter Sunday

WELCOME

On Easter Sunday, all the hopes and expectations of Christians are realised in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, making The Feast of the Resurrection one of the most celebrative days of the church year! The Easter service is a time of joy, celebration, and renewal. In contrast to the somber starkness of Holy Week, on Easter the worship space should be bright and celebratory. Music and songs reflect the full joy of the victorious Christian faith because of Christ's resurrection. Because the good news of Easter cannot hardly be contained in a single day's celebration, Easter is only the first of 50 days of Eastertide, leading up to Pentecost; in addition, every Sunday is a mini-Easter service. Easter joy at the resurrection.
