Now if you were asked that question how do you think you would respond? Perhaps you might talk about a sunset, the corner of a child's lips when he smiles. The formerly blind man didn't mention anything like that. Instead, he said that the most incredible thing was watching the leaves falling in autumn. He said, "I knew that leaves fell. I knew that people raked them and put them in piles and burnt them or throw them away. But I'd always imagined that the leaves would come down just like a blanket. I didn't know that when leaves fall that they pitch and glide and turn in the wind as they come down to the ground. It's beautiful." I remember that story not because of the artistry of his expression. I remember it because of the irony of what he said. The greatest beauty he saw was in dying things. The leaves are dying. That's why they fall to the ground. That's what he identified as the most beautiful thing about getting his sight back. God's creation is a true wonder.

St Stephen's – Collection of food, household and personal care items.

Thank you all for your continued donation of items in the Church box. We would like to inform you that there is a temporary change in the delivery of these items. Dawn Palmer who was collecting the items and delivering them personally to the people in need had to travel back to the UK to provide palliative care for her family member. Until she returns, she has temporarily organised for the items to be supplied to The Learning Refuge centre which provides the same service. Jane, Kevin and I know the Centre well as we do volunteer work there and can assure you that the purpose of our collection has not changed. It is still directly giving to those in need. As a guide, Mary from the Centre has given me the following list which could help when you thinking of what to bring.

Food

Tinned fish, long-life milk, any pulses tinned or dried, (bulger is the favourite), rice, pastas, tinned tomatoes, flour. There are 5-6 families that need baby milk, the Nan milk is good. Baby milk comes in various numbers, No. 3 and 4 are the most useful. The families that are supported have been tragically affected with children needing medical care and baby food is very essential to their needs.

Non-Food

Soap, shampoos, nappies, sanitary ware, detergents.
