GOD SLOT

Along with so many church leaders around the world, I have been preparing for the Christmas services and all the social events over this period. Part of that preparation has been sorting out the various readings that will form the backbone of the services. I always find it fascinating to reread the narrative and see afresh the people God draws into his salvation story (even those people who appear to only have a walk-on part) and also to read of the time spent in the planning and the preparation for the events that took place on that first Christmas morning. Right at the beginning of Mark's Gospel, John the Baptist bursts onto the scene with the words of the prophet Isaiah echoing around him: *"Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him."* (Mark 1: 3) John's role was to prepare the way for Christ. John wasn't the 'main attraction' (and he recognised that) but his vocation was to prepare the road, to be part of the delegation who carry out the pre-visit preparation for any state visit. That role is not always an easy one, Isaiah describing it as a 'voice in the wilderness.' We are called to be part of that faithful delegation who are 'preparing the way for the Lord' in today's world. Helping our world to encounter *"the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie."* (Mark 1: 7) We will all be engaging in a time of preparation over the next few weeks in order to help the salvation message be more clearly heard and understood by our communities. The message doesn't change, but how we communicate it might. Our culture is different to John's, our time is different to John's; BUT our message is the same. Let us be prepared and ready for Jesus to come again as he promised and to make sure we let others know that they too should be ready.
